

SCHOOL DRESS CODE

At Tuart Rise Primary School we have a learning environment that is welcoming, inclusive, collaborative and caring. Our Student Dress Code promotes a sense of community, identity and safety for all students and epitomises our motto of 'Belong and Become'.

Tuart Rise Primary School students are required to adhere to the dress requirements outlined in this dress code. The School Uniform colours are navy blue and teal blue.

The dress code includes:

- Tuart Rise Primary School polo shirt.
- Tuart Rise Primary School jacket.
- Tuart Rise Primary School dress.
- Navy blue pants, tracksuit pants, shorts, skirt or skorts (length of shorts, skorts, and skirts must be mid-thigh or longer).
- Navy blue jackets and jumpers.
- Tuart Rise PS Faction Shirts ('Faction Fridays' and Carnivals only).
- Tuart Rise brimmed hat or similar. 2023 onwards.
- Appropriate footwear joggers/sneakers for physical education and sport. Sandals fastened to the foot are suitable for daily use not recommended for physical education and sport.
- Hair shoulder length or longer must be tied back, neat and tidy and off the face.

Jewellery items are limited to:

- Simple studs or sleeper earrings.
- One unobtrusive finger ring.
- Simple linked necklace with small pendent.
- Wristwatch (not a smartwatch that receives messages).

Not Permitted:

- Makeup (students will be required to remove this).
- Fake / false nails, coloured nail polish (students will be asked to remove this).
- Bike pants 2024 onwards.
- Smart watches.
- Denim (including jeans).
- Caps. (Legionaries' caps accepted) 2023 onwards.
- Thongs, Crocs or similar and open top shoes except on medical grounds or during swimming lessons.
- Excessive hair adornments, temporary or permanent hair colours that are not natural shades eg: red, green, blue etc (except for special days). (UPDATED JUNE 2024).
- Large earrings, spacer earrings, dangly earrings etc.
- Visible body piercings other than earlobes (students will be required to remove this).
- Excessive or valuable jewellery.
- Slogans or icons deemed inappropriate for a primary school context, on clothing.
- Hoodie jumpers.

School Dress Compliance

When students arrive for school dressed in a manner that does not comply with the School Dress Code:

- Teaching staff will send the student to the office for review.
- Contact will be made with the parent/caregiver, by phone and/or by letter by a member of leadership staff.
- The student will be offered a spare school shirt/top to wear for the school day and will need to return prior to being dismissed in the afternoon.
- Students may be required to remove jewellery during the duration of an activity. The safe keeping of these items remains the responsibility of the student.

Family Support

- Some families may be having difficulty obtaining the school uniform Parents are able to discuss this confidentially with the Principal or Deputy Principals.
- Families can be provided with school uniform clothing items through the school and sponsors grants where eligible.
